



Dusk the Baby Owl

CROCHET AMIGURUMI PATTERN BY MJ CARLOS



MATERIALS REQUIRED

- Grey yarn (worsted weight/10 ply)
- Cream or Beige yarn (light worsted weight/8 ply)
- Yellow yarn (light worsted weight/8 ply)
- Crochet Hook size 4mm/US 6/UK 8
- Safety eyes
- Yarn Needle
- Pins
- Stitch marker (optional)
- Toy stuffing

ABBREVIATIONS (US Crochet Terms)

- sc** - single crochet
- hdc** - half double crochet
- inc** - increase (2 single crochet in one stitch)
- dec** - decrease (2 single crochet together)
- FLO** – front loops only



Pattern Notes

DIFFICULTY: EASY/BEGINNER 

You need to know how to: make a magic ring, crochet in a spiral, single crochet, half double crochet, single crochet increase and decrease, crocheting in the front loops, do basic embroidery and sew open pieces together.

This owl was made by crocheting in spirals. You may choose to place stitch markers to mark and move at the end of each round.

BODY – Use Grey

Rounds	Stitches	No. of stitches
1	6 sc in magic ring	6
2	2 sc in each stitch around	12
3	Sc 1, inc; repeat 6 times	18
4	Sc 2, inc; repeat 6 times	24
5	Sc 3, inc; repeat 6 times	30
6	Sc 4, inc; repeat 6 times	36
7	Sc 5, inc; repeat 6 times	42
8-19	Sc around	42
20	Sc 5, dec; repeat 6 times	36
21	Sc 4, dec; repeat 6 times	30
22	Sc 3, dec; repeat 6 times	24
23	Sc 2, dec; repeat 6 times. Fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing.	18

EYE PATCHES (Make 2) – Use Cream/Beige

Rounds	Stitches	No. of stitches
1	10 hdc in magic ring	10
2	2 hdc in each stitch around	20
3	Sc around FLO. Fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing.	20

WINGS (Make 2) – Use Cream/Beige

Rounds	Stitches	No. of stitches
1	6 sc in magic ring	6
2	2 sc in each stitch around	12
3	Sc 1, inc; repeat 6 times	18
4	Sc 2, inc; repeat 6 times	24
5	Sc around	24
6	Sc 12 (do not crochet into the other 12 stitches). Fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing.	24

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DUSK THE BABY OWL



Assembly

Push the safety eyes onto the very centre of each eye patches but don't attach the backing yet. Align the eye patches onto the owl's body. You can refer to my photo for the position. When you are happy with the position, make sure that the safety eyes are pushed through the eye patches as well as the body –if they are, attach the backing from the inside of the body. This can be tricky if your safety eyes are small. Use pins to hold the eye patches in place so you can sew them onto the body. I used a running stitch method.

You can now fill the owl with toy stuffing but not fill all the way to the top. Stitch the opening together with a running stitch method to close. Push down on the centre and pull at the corners to create the pointy ears.

Sew on the wings onto the side of the body using a whipstitch method. Make sure the sewing tail end is pointing down.

Lastly, with the yellow yarn, embroider the beak.
